

2025 SCA Cheerleader Camp McNeese State University-Session III, July 7,8,9

Thank you for choosing SCA for your cheerleading training. The SCA staff is prepared to make your summer camp experience extraordinary. Please read the following information carefully.

<u>CAMP INFORMATION</u>: You have the option to bring a pom routine for opening night competition. Some squads may choose not to bring a home Pom routine to camp. Simply do what is best for your team. It will be advantageous to your team to have stunt groups formed prior to camp.

Optional Pom Competition:

WHEN: First night of camp

WHAT: Perform a pom routine to music, not to exceed 1 minute and 30 seconds. <u>No</u> stunting, jumping, or tumbling is allowed in the pom routine. **Tumbling is defined as any skill with feet over head rotation**.

Camp Evaluations:

WHEN: Second night of camp & Final day evaluation/competition. **WHAT:** Each team will be evaluated on material learned at camp.

Your SCA staff buddy will help you develop your routine and incorporate stunts, signs, and tumbling. The final day evaluation/competition may consist of the same material used previously or different camp material.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR CAMP: It's a good idea to have stunt groups formed and some basic formations to utilize private coaching time most efficiently. Bring poms, megaphones, and signs. SCA cheer/chant words include school colors, mascots, and school letters.

<u>WHAT TO BRING</u>: Original copies of waiver forms for each participant. A squad first aid kit: Band-Aids, ace-bandage, instant cold pack, aspirin, throat lozenges, and hand sanitizer! Twin sheets, pillow, towels, practice clothes, water bottle, spending money, and change for vending machine. SCA encourages squads to bring creative signs to showplace in the camp area. **Glitter is not allowed. Do not bring valuables**.

BALANCE PAYMENT: Final payment is due 30 days prior to the first day of camp. Confirm that SCA has received your online camp registration so that we have your updated contact information and the names of each adult attending camp.

REGISTRATION: Report to the Residence Life Club Room at 565 Beauregard Drive on Monday, July 7, between 10:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Parking is free of charge.

RESIDENT DORM CAMPERS: Medical Release forms will be collected at registration, as well only one **\$100 key deposit.** The university will assess a \$100 fee for each lost key. Authentic metal keys will be utilized rather than plastic key cards. SCA will accept checks. One designated person should collect all keys and turn them in during check-out. Bring linens for twin beds. The suites are 6-person and 2-person suites. Each suite has complete bathroom facilities. The hall has washers, dryers, and vending machines. MSU has limited resident housing space and must get maximum use out of the available space. For example, if a team has 13 participants, it will get two 6-person suites and an extra mattress for the thirteenth person. Visitors may not enter the dorm without your coach's express permission. The hall is supervised by MSU Resident Assistants and SCA staff.

HOTEL OPTION: CHECK-IN at the hotel will be after the first camp session. Campers checking in to hotel will leave first. Luggage can be stored at the hotel beginning at 9:00 AM.

<u>COMMUTER CAMPERS</u>: Report to the Legacy Center for opening at 1:30 p.m. Coaches will receive name badges and camp schedules in the opening orientation meeting and Medical Release forms will be collected at that time. Remember that commuter campers are instruction only; meals are not included.

<u>MEALS</u>: Resident campers only are served six meals during camp, starting with dinner the first evening and ending with lunch the last day.

EMERGENCIES: Campus Police (337) 475 5711.

MASCOTS: Bring your mascot suit and a 1-minute skit which defines your character through pantomime and antics. Bring markers, poster paper, and potential props! It is imperative for all mascots to come prepared with these materials!

COACH PROGRAM: Coaches are encouraged to bring a copy of their tryout score sheets and constitutions, as well as any videos of pep rallies or special performances they would like to share in the coach meetings.

CAMP MERCHANDISE: At the end of each camp day campers will have the opportunity to purchase camp merchandise.

<u>COMPETITION AFTER SUMMER CAMP</u>: SCA is awarding a paid bid to the SCA Battle at the Bayou competition, December 6, 2025, at all SCA camps. The Bayou championship team will be awarded a paid bid to Nfinity's America's Cup Championship, February 7-8, 2026, Universal Studios, Orlando, Florida.

Attention: Coaches & Parents

GUESTS: Parents and spectators are invited to watch the competition at 6:45 p.m. on Day I and the final competition beginning at 3:00 p.m. followed immediately by the individual All-American competition on the last day.

<u>CHECK-OUT</u>: Dorm check-out is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. after lunch on Day III. If squad transportation is not available at that time, luggage may be stored in your coach's room until the end of camp so that all keys except one will be turned in during check-out. The coach's key will then be turned in separately at the end of camp and the key deposit returned. HOTEL OPTION: Hotel check-out will be on Day III after breakfast.
